### WHY DID KEY2ED, INC., PREVIOUSLY JDL ASSOCIATES, DEVELOP FACILITATION FOR IEP MEETINGS?

- In 1975, Congress passed the Education for Handicapped Children Act (EHA), no training programs existed to train IEP team members to make consensus-based decisions *collaboratively*.
